Delhi – a global metropolis with historic buildings

Delhi is located in the north of the Indian subcontinent, where it combines with New Delhi to form the Indian capital. The city proper population is approximately 11 million, making Delhi India's second-largest city after Mumbai and ensuring it remains one of the world's megacities. The national rail network makes the Indian capital accessible from every region in the country and the nearby Indira Gandhi International Airport means Delhi is easy to get to from other countries too. With its many institutions such as universities, museums and theatres, Delhi is India's economic, trade and cultural centre.

Delhi has existed since 1200 BC. According to the ancient Indian epic, the "Mahabharata", it was founded in that year with the name **Indraprastha**, and this assumption has been confirmed by archaeological findings. The city's history following its founding is dominated by conquests, periods of prosperity, and leadership changes. From the beginning of the 19th century, it was then dominated by British colonial rule. This started in 1911 and, among other things, included the systematic construction of New Delhi, which is still home to all India's governmental bodies to-day. Delhi is also known as the city of seven cities. This is based on the fact that you can see the ruins of seven former cities that were established in the area the current Delhi now occupies.

Delhi is a **city of diversity** and a place where people of different cultures come together. The majority of residents practise Hinduism, and Delhi's city proper area is home to a large number of people who have moved there, not just from other parts of India, but also from the surrounding countries. All these factors contribute to the cultural diversity in the Indian capital.

Delhi offers a number of attractions for **night lovers** as well. More and more bars, discos and nightclubs have opened in recent years, with *Connaught Place* in particular boasting a range of options for a fun and interesting evening as a touristic and economic hub of the city. It has several bars whose decor is in keeping with the Wild West. These establishments serve various types of cocktails. In contrast, the Pegasus Bar reminds you of the British pub culture.

The climate in northern India is subtropical, which explains the huge contrast between the region's winter and summer temperatures. From March to June, the weather is predominantly dry with high temperatures. In July, the climate is then dominated by the south-west monsoon, which brings enormous amounts of precipitation and therefore also increases humidity levels. **The best time for a trip to Delhi is between December and February**, because humidity levels are low, there is hardly any rain and the temperatures are pleasant.





City Tour on 28.2.2020

On the third day, we will experience life in (Old) Delhi together.

Old Delhi has its roots in the era of the Mughal emperors, who used the region surrounding the Red Fort as the capital of their empire. This part of Delhi reflects the typical Indian cityscape and together we will be sampling the charm of Old Delhi here.

An Indian city tour would, of course, not be complete without a ride in a **tuk-tuk**, which you may know as a *rickshaw*. This offers you the opportunity to lean back, feel the Indian wind on your skin and hair, and enjoy the views of Old Delhi's lively and colourful bazaars without having to fight your way through the chaotic traffic on foot.

One important stop on our tour is the **Jama Masjid**, India's largest mosque. The building was opened in 1656 by the Mughal emperor *Shah Jahan*, who had already built the *Taj Mahal* and the *Red Fort*. Built using red sandstone at a cost of one million rupees, the imposing structure took six years to complete and 5,000 labourers were involved in its construction.

The mosque sits on a rocky hill above a number of buildings in Delhi. Walking through the main entrance gate will take you into the large courtyard. This is able to accommodate over 20,000 worshippers, who gather to pray after conducting a traditional washing process every Friday, meaning the religious building is the world's largest Friday mosque.

Instead of the usual engraved Koranic verses, the building is dotted with inscriptions that promote the builder, *Shah Jahan*, and imply that the Mughal wanted to dedicate a monument to himself. Every Friday, he and his court would go to the mosque in a procession and demonstrate his power. His own son eventually overthrew him in the year the *Jama Masjid* was completed. The impressive building continues to draw in masses of tourists even today.

Visit of the Indo-German Chamber of Commerce

A meeting with representatives from the Indian fire and security industry has been arranged at the Indo-German Chamber of Commerce's Delhi location. This will give you the opportunity to acquire national contacts and specialist knowledge of the industry in India, which will enhance your cultural understanding of the industry in the country.

The **FSAI** is a non-profit organization that was founded in 2002 to represent the fields of fire protection, life safety, security, building automation, loss prevention and risk management. It is working closely with the Indian government and all other stakeholders to enable the Indian fire and security industry to reach global pre-eminence with an excellent regulatory framework.

Good to know

All German nationals must hold a passport that is valid for at least six months and has at least two free pages in order to enter India. A tourist visa is also required. (You can apply for one of these via this website: www.indianvisaonline.gov.in/visa/tvoa.html) Obtaining a visa on arrival is not possible. You can expect checks too and providing incorrect information can result in refusal of entry at the border or deportation from the country.

Non-German nationals should contact their embassy for the requirements they need to fulfil.

Organizer
