

Your admittance to the event

All groups of people with a valid e-ticket who have been verifiably vaccinated, recovered or tested (**3G-status**) can participate in the event.

This is how it works:

Advance registration

Register in the online ticket shop and if applicable, upload a QR code certificate* to activate the ticket for direct access to the exhibition



Entry control at the entrance

Fast Lane

Only for activated ticket holders via one-time scan or with e-ticket plus approved QR code certificate* via double scan

Clearing Lane

Manual inspection of e-ticket and 3G-certificate (e.g. vaccine pass, regional digital vaccination proof, test certificate, recovered persons)

Emergency testing capacities available on site > waiting time must be planned



On-site safety instructions



1.5 meter safety distance



Hand hygiene (washing and disinfecting)



Follow the rules for coughing and sneezing



Face covering



No shaking hands or hugging



Use contactless payment whenever possible

Valid admission certificates (3G-certificates)



Vaccinated*:

- Proof of complete vaccination more than 14 days ago
- Valid are analog vaccination certificates and digital vaccination certificates with a vaccine approved in the EU



Recovered*:

- Positive PCR test with date (at least 28 days ago, but not longer than six months ago)
- Or official quarantine order (not more than six months ago) together with a later negative test



Tested*:

- Negative test result (Antigen test not more than 24 hours ago; PCR test not more than 48 hours ago)
- Self tests are not permitted

***approved QR code certificate via**
EU Green Certificate, Coronavirus Warning App, CovPass-App, Luca-App (others under review)

Children and teenagers:

- Children under 14 years of age may only attend the event if accompanied by an adult. Registration is not required, access is possible via the service entrances.
- Teenagers aged 14 and over may only attend the event after registration and with their own ticket and 3G proof.
- Non-vaccinated or recovered children over the age of 6 must present a negative test result. If they are school children and are subject to regular testing as part of their school attendance, they are considered to have tested negative and do not need to present additional proof.
